Executive Summary

The Procurement Act 2023 Update

The Act is officially titled the Procurement Act 2023 - this is the primary legislation, but the secondary legislation that sits under it will be called the Procurement Regulations 2024. The secondary legislation has been delayed and is expected to be released mid-March which will begin the 6 month implementation period. Procurement will be using the term 'Procurement Regulations' as we feel that this is easier for our stakeholders to understand and that it is relatable to procurement rather than stating 'the Act'.

Superuser sessions in February concentrated on the learning package. The Knowledge Drops have been released and the e-learning modules will be launched in April. An overview was provided of the e-learning which looks very user friendly and detailed.

It was announced that 150 questions would be published, technical policy guidance for 52 areas is being released and a helpdesk is now available to provide support. Learning aids and flow charts are being developed by the cabinet office on the thresholds, procedures and notices.

Other updates

The Procurement team have been working hard to support on UAT for the new finance system.

The whole team attended a full day training on Modern Slavery to increase our awareness and understanding of this subject and assist with what steps we can take if modern slavery is suspected.



Property / FM Category Headlines

Work progressing on the following projects:

• Electric Vehicle Chargers – Estimated £53,000. Contract awarded to JPS Renewable Energy Ltd against KCS framework, Y21002 - Electric Vehicle Charging Points & Associated Services, work started across 14 key sites for electric and hybrid vehicles, expected to complete end of March 2024.

- Vending Machines Preparing to run a mini-competition against the KCS Y23009 Catering, Vending Machines & Water Coolers framework for 1 snack and cold drink and 2 hot drink vending machines for the Kelvedon Park Muster area.
- Lockers Estimated £10,000 request for quotes were received and evaluated for Lockers at Kelvedon Park, the order was placed with Bates Office Furniture, the lockers will be delivered and installed by the end of March 2024
- Office Furniture Estimated £30,000, funded from Capital Asset Protection, New Ways of Working Project. Reviewing available frameworks for muster area and canteen furniture, ensuring best value and delivery within our required timescales.
- Water and Wastewater Supply & Billing Services Estimated cost £373,745 for 3 + 2 year term. In collaboration with 7 Forces Procurement a further competition was carried out against the Laser framework for the Water and Wastewater Supply & Billing Services across all sites, the evaluation is due to be complete by mid-March. Decision sheet to be submitted for approval to award.



ICT Category Headlines

Work progressing on the following projects:


- **Mobile Display Terminals Mapping Software –** Renewal awarded to Airbus Defence for the MDT SafeCommand software. Awarded via the Crown Commercial Service RM6259 Vertical Application Solutions framework Lot 5: Blue Light Solutions. Awarded at cost of £125,000
- Mobile Display Terminals Crash Recovery System Renewal awarded to Airbus Defence for Moditech Crash Recovery system software after comparable benchmarks. Software found from various 3rd party resellers, but none offer an integration into the Airbus SafeCommand software. Awarded at cost of £50,000
- Hewlett Packard Enterprise support Award after request for quote process for the maintenance and support for HPE and Nimble servers for the amount of £32,000 to the supplier Support Warehouse.
- **Resource Optimisation Call** A cost avoidance tool was discussed with Directors for the allocation of resources to assist in saving fuel and resources from appliances that would increase standard response time as well. Early colleague engagement to other Fire and Rescue Services for information, allocated budget of £230,000.
- **Multi Carrier Sims** Request for quote for the purchase of roaming sims of approximately £3,000 per annum for the prevention department to increase communication and response times to be procured via a request for quotation process.




Corporate Services and Operations Category Headlines

Work progressing on the following projects:


- Workwear First set of samples received and evaluated. Three suppliers providing the second stage samples due end of March for measured garments for operational trials for staff in Control, Colchester and Chelmsford fire stations and breathing apparatus instructors.
- **PHEM D training** estimated costs £505k over 4 years -Tender was run under the Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service national framework. Decision sheet presented for approval to proceed to award.
- **Thermal Imaging Cameras** estimated costs £650k in collaboration with Herts Fire Service. This was run under the NFCC National Emergency Response Equipment Framework. Decision sheet presented for approval to proceed to award.
- **Positive-Pressure Ventilation Fans –** estimated cost £130k Standstill completed and tender awarded this was run by Suffolk Fire Service under the NFCC National Emergency Response Equipment Framework.
- Layflat hoses estimated £58k Tender was run under the NFCC National Emergency Response Equipment Framework, in evaluation for approval to award.
- End of Life Vehicles for RTC training following supply issues from our current contract a tender is being prepared for release in April due to legislation changes required to the specification.
- **Driving Licence checks –** following a request for quote process the contract has been awarded, £15k over 3 years finalising contract terms and conditions and internal processes.








